I grew up in the Chicago area where I attended Midwestern schools receiving both my undergraduate and doctorate degrees. I was always ambitious, from my early beginnings as a souvenir salesman at Wrigley Field. Following graduation from Law School, I married and soon thereafter, had two beautiful girls.

Mid-life, I decided to change career paths and became involved as an Executive at an early stage Bio diagnostic test development company. My principal responsibility during the nearly ensuing decade was to raise sufficient capital to support the company's mission to secure FDA approval of rapid diagnostic tests. During these years, I regrettably made many irrational business decisions which ultimately led to a civil lawsuit being filed against me and the company. Soon thereafter, the civil case morphed into a criminal investigation, ultimately culminating in a criminal indictment to which I pleaded guilty to and was sentenced to a 14 year federal prison sentence. Though there was no theft of funds alleged, I did misrepresent company prospects at times during the years and that

misconduct was the basis for my conviction.

I spent a bit under 11 years in federal prison. The humiliation and pain that I caused my family was and is incalculable. Throughout all of this, my children steadfastly stood by me and did so with unyielding strength and conviction. It is largely their strength that fueled my continued hope for a better tomorrow.

A person is never truly joyful in prison, but I tried to be as positive as I could. In some ways, I was fortunate. For most of my stay, I had relatively decent living conditions - relative to many others. I shared rooms with 2 to 6 men instead of 14 men. I had very normal, nice roommates the entire time. Only 5% of crimes in our institution were white collar crimes. There were only a few Jews which did result in some prejudice within the institution.

During my nearly 11 years in several federal correctional institutions, my very favorite time of year was Purim and celebrating with both a visiting Rabbi or Rabbis together with my fellow Jewish inmate friends. Following the Rabbis' amazing readings of the Megillah, we routinely would put on

our party hats and be handed several types of "noise makers" and feel the joy of Purim as we danced together for what seemed like forever. Then and most memorably, we together shared in Hamentashen cookies, a treat like no other while living in captivity! These are memories that will remain with me until my final days on this earth when I will, I pray, have one last opportunity to recite the Shema. I feel grateful for the Chabad rabbis who took the time to visit us.

I am well aware of my inability to change my past, though I now have chosen to embrace my past with a renewed and committed positivity. The great shame I feel that has been a continuing noose around my neck is slowly giving way to a willingness to self-forgive, which will only then, allow me to continue onward in a truly healthy fashion . Hashem has provided me

with a second chance, and I am committed to becoming the best version of

myself as is His desire for all of us.
